Parking

Following another near accident involving a child and a vehicle outside school this week, we have been forced to take further action with regards to the ongoing parking situation. The safety of all children is put at risk when parents choose to park dangerously outside the school grounds. We have received several complaints about parents parking on double and single yellow lines, on the zigzags and crossings outside the main entrances and also parking on pavements making it inaccessible for pushchairs and wheelchairs. The matter has been discussed with the School Governors and we have now requested the involvement of the local policing team. Please be aware that in parking in a dangerous and inconsiderate manner you are putting your own children and the children of others in a dangerous situation. We will be continuing to monitor this as a school and local community and ask for your full support in keeping the children and families of Mudeford Infants School safe.
